I immigrated at the age of 15 from Guayaquil Ecuador, it was one of the hardest moments in my life since I did not know the language, the culture was completely different, I had no friends and the rest of my family separated from me. When I was only 15 years old, I learned a lot and from there I understood how difficult it was for many immigrant families to live in this country. Little by little I understood the laws learning a different system from mine, different cultures even speaking Spanish we have different dialects, I learned that we are all the same only with different flavors and customs.

My 5 children taught me to know more about the system and to realize again that empathy and knowledge are needed. From there I began to help my community with what I had learned, I started being part of the PTA of the schools volunteering in PMS, churches and Salvation Army. I worked for 11 years as a waitress then manager at the same time I worked at Santa Fe Youth Works as a case manager, helping the community find more resources and give them more knowledge. Eventually I created my FB page (help the community through the Unit) to be able to reach more people and be able to help them outside of work with resources that the city has to offer, we created a food distribution program with the help of Youth Works where we gave 1600 boxes of food a week to families in need, all this happened in times of pandemic, for this I already had a lot of knowledge of how I could help families and businesses and I started to create my organization (Latino Small Business Association) already understanding the needs of the Latino community working with different organizations and with the help of the city council Pilar Faulkner and Lee García to be able to help with better resources to the community of Santa Fe and we have managed to create a better space for the families of my community

Inmigré a los 15 años de guayaquil Ecuador, fueron unos de los momentos más duros en mi vida ya que no conocía el idioma, la cultura era completamente diferente, no tenía amigos y el resto de mi familia separados de mí. Con tan solo 15 años aprendí mucho y desde ahí entendí lo difícil que era para muchas familias inmigrantes el vivir en este país. Poco a poco fui entendiendo las leyes aprendiendo un sistema diferente al mío, diferentes culturas incluso hablando español tenemos diferentes dialectos, aprendí que todos somos lo mismo solo con diferentes sabores y costumbres.

Mis 5 hijos me enseñaron a conocer más el sistema y a darme cuenta otra vez que hace falta empatía y conocimiento. Desde ahí empiezo ayudar a mi comunidad con lo que yo había aprendido empecé siendo parte del PTA de las escuelas haciendo voluntariado en PMS, iglesias y Salvation Army. Trabajé por 11 años como mesera luego manager al mismo tiempo trabajé en Santa Fe Youth Works como case management, ayudando a la comunidad a encontrar más recursos y darles más conocimiento. Eventualmente cree mi página de FB (ayuda a la comunidad a través de la Unidad) para poder alcanzar más personas y poder ayudarlos fuera del trabajo con recursos que la ciudad tiene q ofrecer, creamos un programa de repartición de comida con la ayuda de Youth Works en donde dábamos 1600 cajas de comida a la semana a familias necesitadas todo esto paso en tiempo de pandemia, para esto ya tenía mucho conocimiento de cómo podía ayudar a familias y negocios y empecé a crear mi organización (Latino Small Business Association) ya entendiendo las necesidades de la comunidad latina trabajando con diferentes organizaciones y con la ayuda de la city council Pilar Faulkner y Lee García para poder ayudar con mejores recursos a la comunidad de Santa Fe y hemos logrado crear un mejor espacio para las familias de mi comunidad

María José Rodríguez Cádiz, a native of Spain, has been living in Santa Fe for over three decades. In the late 90's she worked in the areas of Restorative Justice and Conflict Resolution. She has been a staff member at Solace Sexual Assault Services since 2002 and as the Executive Director since 2011. She is responsible for overall program's management, compliance, development and financial sustainability. She was an advisory board member with Self Awareness and Schools Support for Girls (SASS), and a Board Member with the Santa Fe Rotary Club. She is currently a Board Member with La Familia Health and the Santa Fe Community Foundation.

Rebecca K. (Becky) Rowley- Biography

Rebecca K. (Becky) Rowley started as president of SFCC on July 1, 2019. Prior to being named president of SFCC, she was president of Clovis Community College in Clovis, New Mexico since 2011. Prior to becoming president, she was Executive Vice President (Academics and Student Services) at CCC. Before moving into administration, she taught English as a full-time faculty member at Clovis Community College for seven years.

Since joining SFCC, Rowley has emphasized student-focused success in a collaborative environment that engages students, faculty and staff. President Rowley has led with a strong focus on efficiency and transparency. Rowley reaches out to community leaders and responds to the community's needs.
