BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:

As outlined in the enabling legislation (attached), the TAB plays a vital role in providing strategic guidance and recommendations to support transit services in Santa Fe.

Per the legislation, TAB The Transit Advisory Board shall have nine (9) members, all of whom shall be residents of Santa Fe County. Members must possess relevant expertise in areas such as Business/Chamber of Commerce, Education, Elderly, Disabled, Convention and Visitors Bureau/Tourism, Institutional/Governmental, (3) At Large Members. Additionally, the composition of the board should reflect the diversity of our transit sector and community at large.

The City has reviewed and vetted nine (9) applicants for the TAB who meet the established criteria. These candidates are being recommended for appointment. They are as follows: Andrea Archuleta (Institutional/Governmental), Aurore Bleck (Elderly & Disability), Owen Conely (Education & Disability), Juan Cucalon (Business/Chamber of Commerce), Marcos Maez (Business/Chamber of Commerce & Education), Colin Messer (Business/Chamber of Commerce, Education, Elderly, Institutional/Governmental, & Tourism/Convention Center), Marie Meyer (Business/ Chamber of Commerce & Elderly), Dolores Shapiro (Education & Elderly), Susan Sheldon (Elderly and Institutional/Governmental).
