

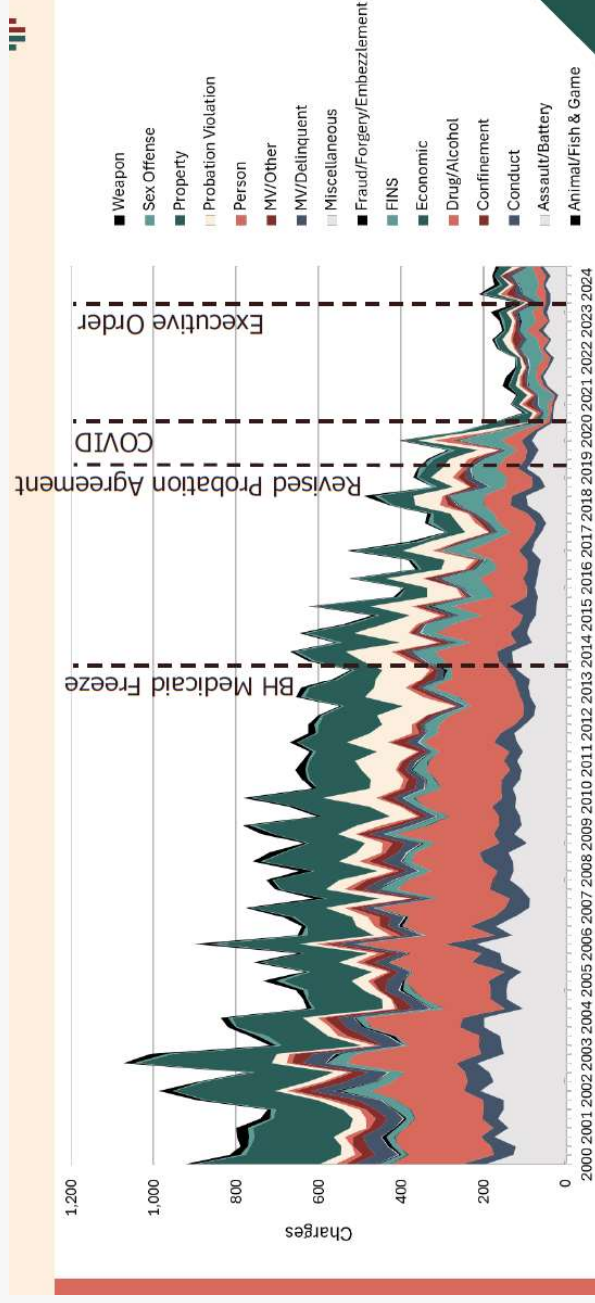

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WHATS HAPPENING IN SANTA FE?

While the City has seen a drastic decrease in youth crime since 2000, coming out of the 2020 pandemic, we have begun seeing a significant rise in violent crime.



In partnership with Santa Fe Police Department, Santa Fe County Community Services, and community we are co-creating an upstream approach, prioritizing those youth most directly associated with violence, centering historic and systemic issues behind violence, poverty, economic injustice, racism. Centering systemic disenfranchisement from services and resources.

CITY STRATEGY FOR YOUTH VIOLENCE

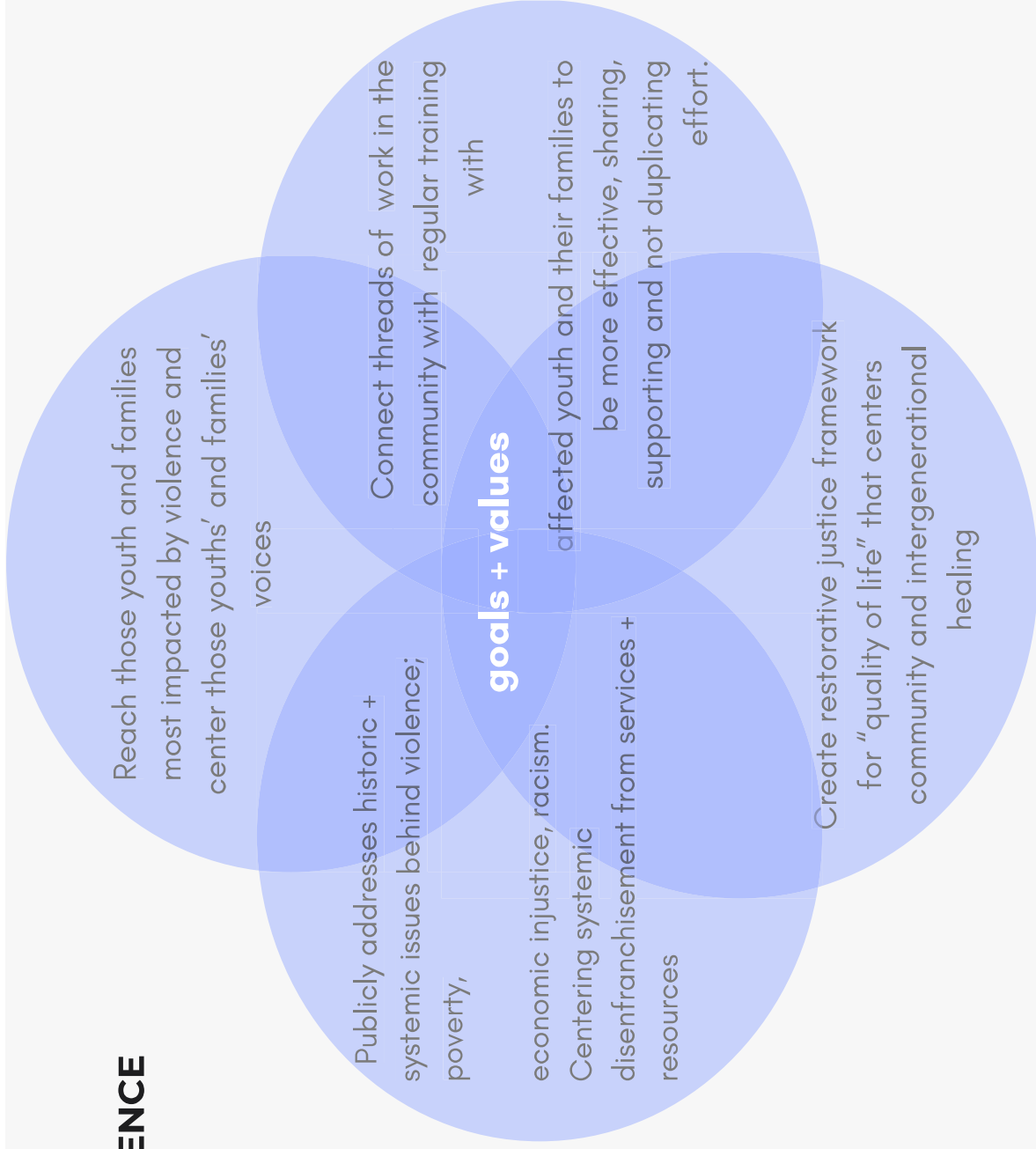
City of Santa Fe Violence Prevention Strategic Plan-

Critical Priority Objective 2

To educate, navigate, and employ youth at high risk for violence and establish a sustainable program to reduce youth gun and gang/group violence.

The pilot should:

- credibly reach youth at high risk for violent victimization or perpetration;
- saturate participants in protective factors that reduce their risk for violence, and
- build participants' capacity to serve as community support workers equipped to contribute to community violence prevention over time.



ENVISIONING RESTORATIVE JUSTICE AND COMMUNITY HEALING

Collectively we created a multidisciplinary task force that includes peers, community leaders, and providers to offer wraparound case management, individual participant support, and accountability for contractual services to interrupt potential patterns of violence for youth at risk for perpetration and victimization of violence.

The goal of the task force is to allow the youth and those most impacted to be the experts in their own lives and what has led them to association with violence to developing and executing a case plan based on youth participant's expertise while holding providers accountable to the co-developed case plan, and making adjustments as necessary.

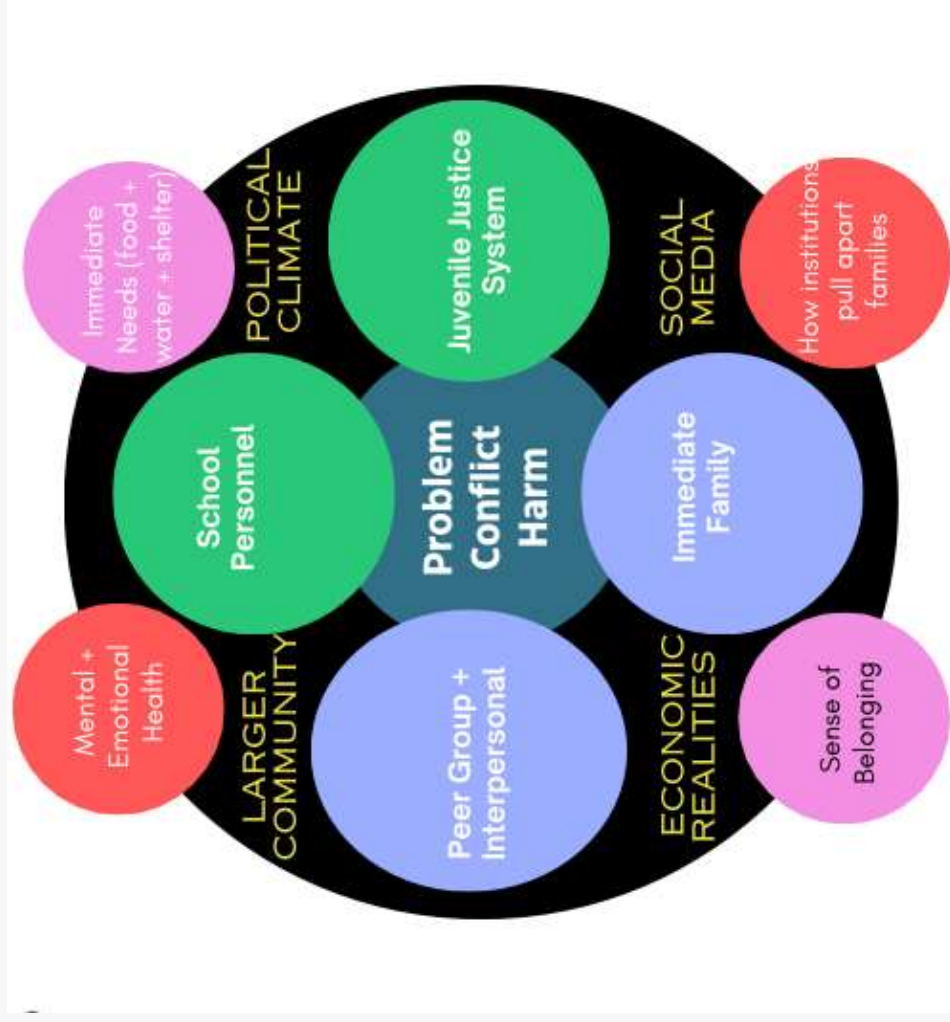

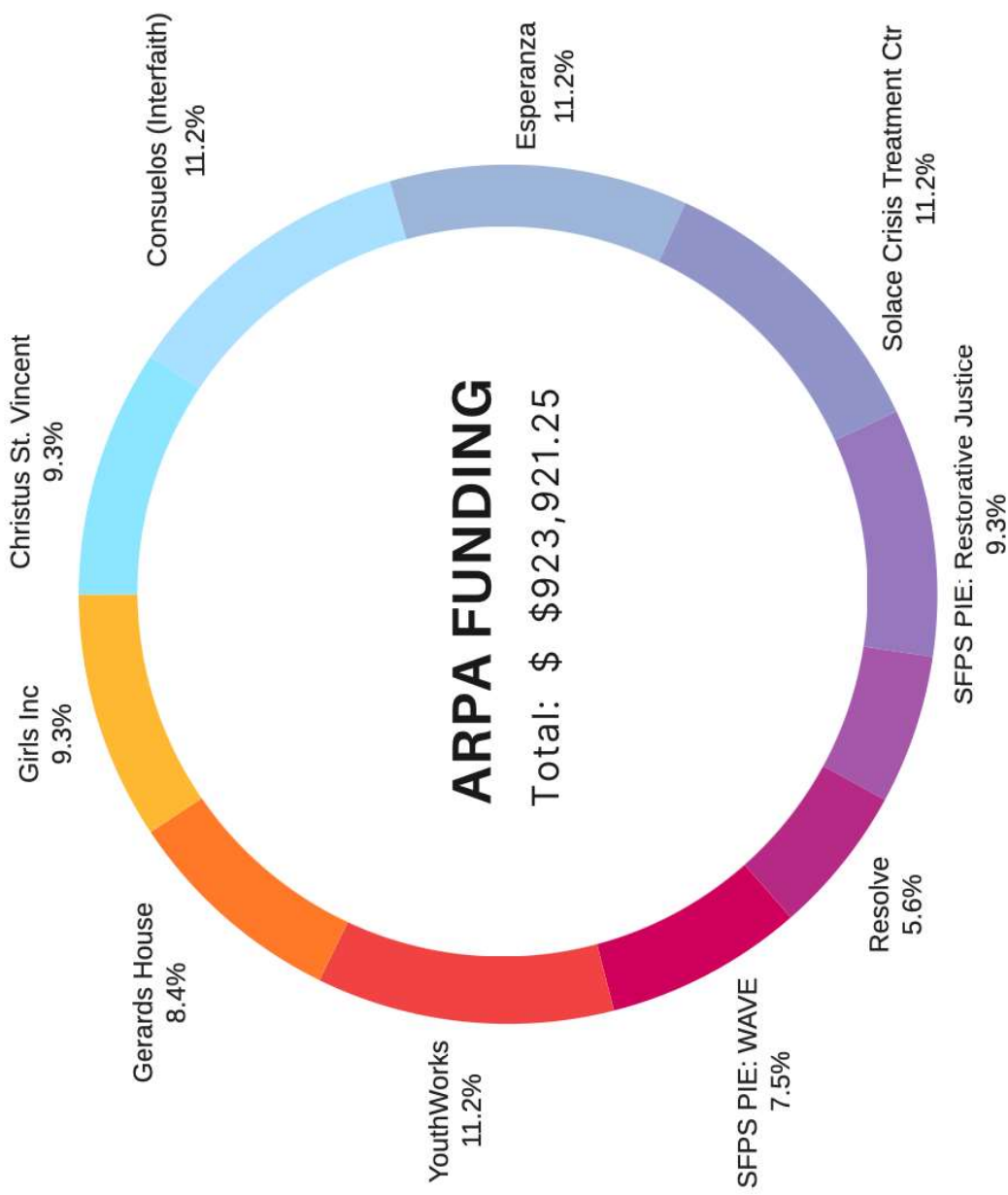

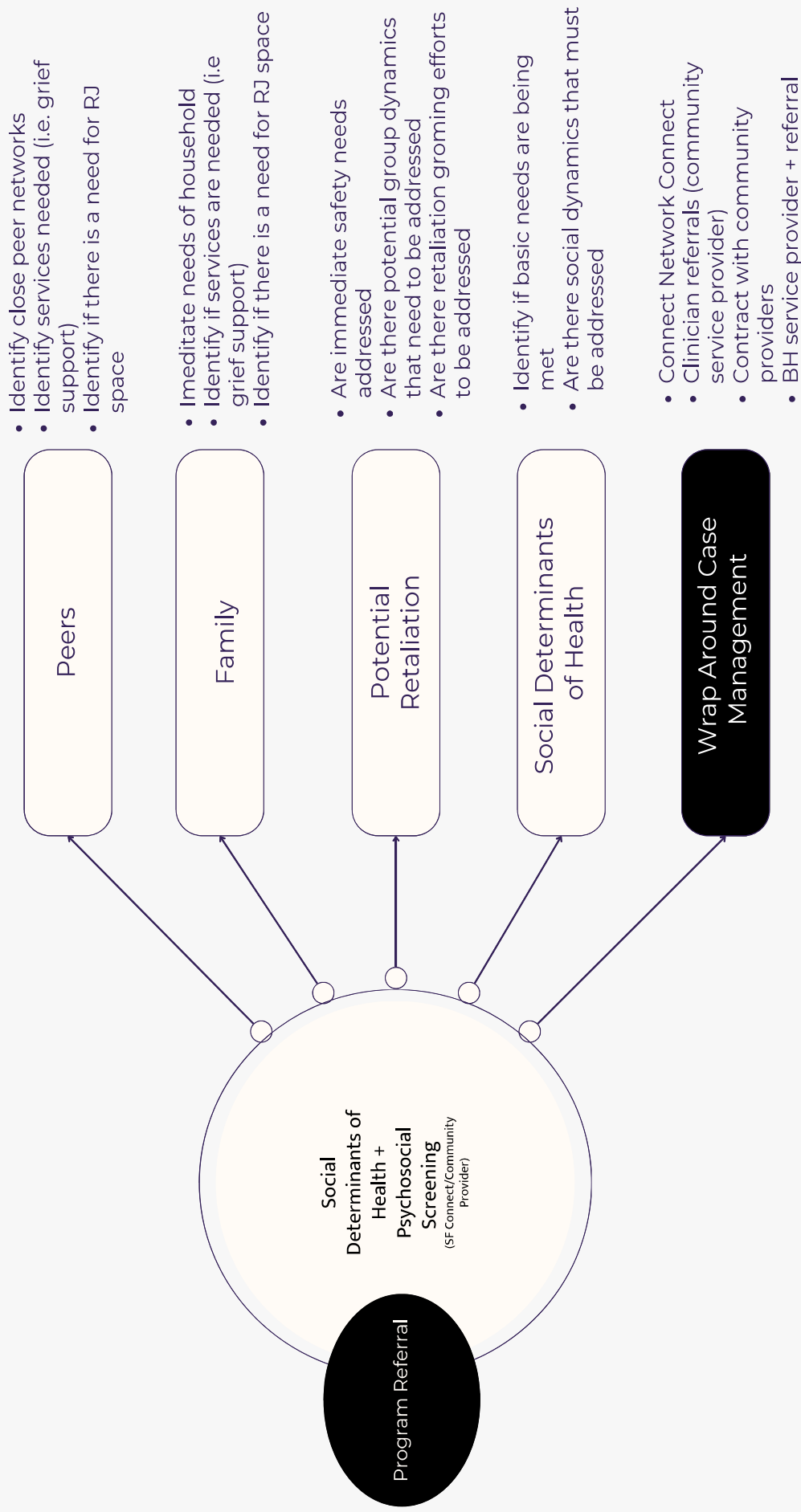
