- Your Comment: I am writing about the proposed development of the over 200 acres west of Capital HS. Case #2025-10685.

I live directly adjacent to the proposed area. Apart from the irrevocable disturbance to the quality of life for current residents and likely decrease of home values, there are many other considerations.

Santa Fe is experiencing a long-term, record-breaking drought, the driest stretch in 1,200 years. There are currently numerous home development projects in town. Where will all the water come from to provide for this massive development?

The proposed area has thousands of trees including numerous old cottonwoods. The land is extremely hilly and slopes quite deeply down to various arroyos, cottonwoods and other trees. This area is home to a vast amount of wildlife – from all sorts of birds including owls, hawks, roadrunners and more as well as numerous other native species. All this habitat would be destroyed with the development.
