- Your Comment: I live off of Governor Miles, and am a neighbor of the proposed development. I oppose this plan. Governor Miles is turning into a sea of Cinder Block Walls. This development is not a “community.” 400 homes with no collocated open space or park area, or community gathering space. And this new stretch of land – the last remaining strip of trees and natural vegetation that have not been leveled - is about to be demolished in favor of cement and asphalt. What has been designed as a “community” is nothing more than parallel rows of cinderblock enclosed storage units (called houses.)

Statistically according to the SF website, there should be 120 children in this development – with no co-located park or open space. The only "common area" will be under the towers of wires running through the property, with retention ponds. Walking trails are located outside, along all the cinderblock walls, (not through the development.)

This is Not what Santa Fe is.
