Calls for Service 2021-2024

- 2021 total calls for service, 77,239.
 - Of those, 19,461 were self-initiated by the officer.
- 2022 total calls for service, 76,877.
 - Of those, 16,129 were self-initiated by the officer.
- 2023 total calls for service, 83,391.
 - Of those, 22,837 were self-initiated by the officer.
- 2024 total calls for service, 84,411.
 - Of those, 20,131 were self-initiated by the officer.

Use of force incidents 2021 – 2024

- 2021 UOF incidents – 79
 - Approx. 1.02 incidents per 1,000 calls for service
 - 2022 UOF incidents – 79
 - Approx. 1.03 incidents per 1,000 calls for service
 - 2023 UOF incidents – 103
 - Approx. 1.27 incidents per 1,000 calls for service
 - 2024 UOF incidents – 131
 - Approx. 1.57 incidents per 1,000 calls for service
- 1 of those was determined to be outside of policy
 - Corrective action issued
 - 2 of those were determined to be outside of policy

 - 4 of those were determined to be outside of policy

Call Types

- **2021** – Domestic violence, **19** UOF incidents
Disorderly conduct, **10** UOF incidents
- **2022** – Shoplifting, **23** UOF incidents
Disorderly conduct, **14** UOF incidents
- **2023** – Disorderly conduct, **22** UOF incidents
Shoplifting, **21** UOF incidents
- **2024** – Disorderly conduct, **36** UOF incidents
Shoplifting, **20** UOF incidents

Response times

- Average response time 14:25 all CFS
 - Domestic – 8:35 Disorderly – 9:24
- Average response time 17:15 all CFS
 - Disorderly conduct – 8:52 Shoplifting – 6:38
- Average response time 14:10 all CFS
 - Disorderly conduct – 8:57 Shoplifting – 6:57
- Average response time 13:52 all CFS
 - Disorderly conduct – 9:49 Shoplifting – 9:33

Vacancies year by year

- 2021 – 33 sworn officer vacancies
 - Average response times 14:25
- 2022 – **38** sworn officer vacancies
 - Average response time **17:15**
- 2023 – 22 sworn officer vacancies
 - Average response time 14:10
- 2024 – **13** sworn officer vacancies
 - Average response time **13:52**

Number of Arrests 2021 – 2024

- **2,762** total arrests for 2021
- **3,665** total arrests for 2022
- **5,228** total arrests for 2023
- **5,065** total arrests for 2024
- Total calls for service 77,239
 - 79 UOF incidents
- Total calls for service 76,877
 - 79 UOF incidents
- Total calls for service 83,391
 - 106 UOF incidents
- Total calls for service 83,411
 - 131 UOF incidents

Wrap up

- In use of force incidents that were determined to be outside of policy, the incident was investigated, and corrective action was issued. During 2023 and 2024 the Santa Fe Police Department vacancies began to decrease, putting more officers on the streets. Having more officers, allows officers to be more proactive (self-initiated) rather than reactive and provide a better response time to calls for service. The number of arrests nearly doubled in 2023 (5228) compared to 2021 (2762).
- The Santa Fe Police Department remains focused on ensuring that force is only used when necessary. Santa Fe Police officers are provided with de-escalation training in order for them to have the skills required to speak with those individuals to help avoid the need for force when applicable.
- The Santa Fe Police Department is staying active with updating policies and providing training for officers. In most incidents where officers are present, officers were able to resolve the situation without having to use force.
