- Your Comment: I am opposed to resurrecting the Soldiers Monument on our plaza.

Almost 1 million dollars have already been wasted that could have been used to remove it and place it elsewhere like the Veterans Memorial Cemetery as has been suggested. The money could also have been spent on affordable housing, feeding children etc

I would like to see something dedicated to the memory of 47 medicine men and Pueblo leaders who were lynched(hung)on SF plaza in 1675 in an attempt to suppress Indigenous religion.

Other racist monuments around town should also be removed.

Spain has removed all monuments and statues dedicated to Franco's fascist regime.

The two most impacted tribes, the Diné and Mescalero, were never consulted by the City Council, nor were any other tribes from the civil war era.

I ask the City Council to hear their concerns and what they would like to see happen regarding the monument.

I am a long time resident of SF since 1988 have worked in healthcare caring for Santa Feans and other New Mexicans for all of those 38 yrs and am not a recent transplant
