- Your Comment: In 1978 the State of New Mexico signed into law the Cultural Properties Act (18-6-1 NMSA 1978) which provides for protection of sites and structures of historical significance within the state, in accordance with the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. The state's law gives the State Historic Preservation Office the authority to work with municipalities to preserve cultural properties within their jurisdictions and requires a report annually to the governor and the legislature. Because of the significant historic value of the obelisk to our City, State and Nation's history, I respectfully request that the City of Santa Fe work cooperatively with the State of New Mexico through its Department of Cultural Affairs, or some other appropriate state agency in accordance with state and federal laws to restore the vandalized obelisk.
