A RESOLUTION

**DESIGNATING THE FIRST MONDAY IN MARCH AS “COVID-19 MEMORIAL DAY”
IN REMEMBRANCE OF THOSE WHO HAVE LOST THEIR LIVES AND IN HONOR
OF THOSE WHO CONTINUE TO SUFFER FROM THE IMPACT OF THE VIRUS; AND
URGING RESIDENTS TO CONTINUE TAKING PREVENTATIVE MEASURES TO
MITIGATE THE SPREAD OF THE VIRUS.**

WHEREAS, other municipalities throughout the country have designated the first Monday
in March as COVID-19 Victims and Survivors Memorial Day; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 (SARS-CoV-2) is an illness caused by a virus that can transmit
from person to person that has spread across the world, creating a global pandemic that is having
catastrophic effects on human life, our community, and our economy; and

WHEREAS, to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, observance of public health orders to
social distance and to stay at home have created challenges for small businesses, workers, and
schools, which are working to comply with limited resources; and

WHEREAS, school districts, teachers, students, and parents are grappling with the

1 challenges of distance learning and working to prevent any potential learning loss due to not
2 teaching in-person; and

3 **WHEREAS**, local and state governments, health departments, and public servants have
4 taken bold actions to protect residents, support struggling local economies, and find innovative
5 ways to provide services; and

6 **WHEREAS**, in response to rapid spread of COVID-19 and stay-at-home orders, essential
7 workers have stepped up to provide critical services to help protect our communities and save lives,
8 sacrificing their own health and safety; and

9 **WHEREAS**, COVID-19 has had a disproportionate impact on low-income communities
10 and communities of color, exacerbating inequities already prevalent in our systems that we must
11 address as a nation; and

12 **WHEREAS**, the symptoms and severity of COVID-19 can vary dramatically by individual
13 and the long-term health implications for survivors is largely unknown, as many survivors suffer
14 with lingering side-effects of the disease long after they no longer test positive; and

15 **WHEREAS**, more than [number at time of adoption] people worldwide and [number at
16 time of adoption] in the United States have lost their lives due to COVID-19, and, in the City of
17 Santa Fe alone, more than [number at time of adoption] lives have been lost to this deadly virus;
18 and

19 **WHEREAS**, each life lost to COVID-19 mattered and leaves a hole in the hearts of loved
20 ones, family members, and surrounding community; and

21 **WHEREAS**, public health guidance and policies targeted at prevention, such as social
22 distancing, wearing masks in public, and staying home help mitigate the spread of COVID-19,
23 prevent illness, and lessen the burden on individuals and society.

24 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Governing Body hereby designates
25 the first Monday in March as “COVID-19 Memorial Day”, in remembrance of those who have lost

1 their lives and in honor of those who continue to suffer from the impact of this virus.

2 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Governing Body joins with over fifty other cities
3 around the country that are recognizing the first Monday in March as “COVID-19 Memorial Day”
4 in remembrance of those who have lost their lives and continue to suffer lasting effects of the virus
5 and to commemorate them in an appropriate manner determined by the City each year.

6 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Governing Body urges residents to continue
7 taking preventative measures such as social distancing and following public health orders to
8 mitigate spread of this virus, in tribute to essential workers and those who rose in service to protect
9 the public.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY:

For several years now the state has been in a severe drought with the need to utilize our Wildland Section throughout spring and fall drought season. The Wildland Section was developed in the Fire Department approximately 10 years ago and has existed through grants. This year grants were not available, therefore we have requested available funds in the General Fund through the Human Resources Department. The Fire Department is requesting approval to hire 15 Seasonal employees. This includes 4 Wildland Sawyers and 11 Wildland Forestry Technicians. The Season normally begins in April through the fall. These employees provide outreach services to our constituents doing property fuel mitigation and assessments to advise the constituents how to prevent fires around their house.

The Wildland Section has partnered with the Santa Fe Water shed and provide assistance with property hazard assessments. They also provide Fire suppression resource for the water shed, fuel mitigation projects for the water shed and provide advice for prescribes burns within the water shed. When they have down time they get assigned to other city division to assess and clean weeds and fire hazards around city buildings.

This group also provides assistance to other neighboring cities, counties and states with wildfires. Through Wildfire Hazard Agreements they also provide support to the Forest Service, Forest Guild and National Park Service.
