Alternative Response Unit

Purpose

To alleviate fire, EMS and police workload and help residents struggling with social and behavioral health issues.



History

- Chief Litzenberg establishes MIHO in 2015.
- EMS data to identify individual and community risk.
- Proactive and longitudinal case management.
- Embedded in community (recipients of service, stakeholders, families, providers, foundations...).
- Before: Focused only on outreach before and after 911 calls.
- Now: ARU adds capability to bring MIH to 911 calls.



Operations

One unit, 40 hours/week

(generally M-F 0800-1800);

Other hours as directed.



Vehicle

Marked SUV with police and fire radio.



Staffing

One paramedic, one case manager
on unit;

Backed up by a case management team;

Originally officer on unit but since returned to Patrol.
ARU Officer remains important link to Patrol and PD.

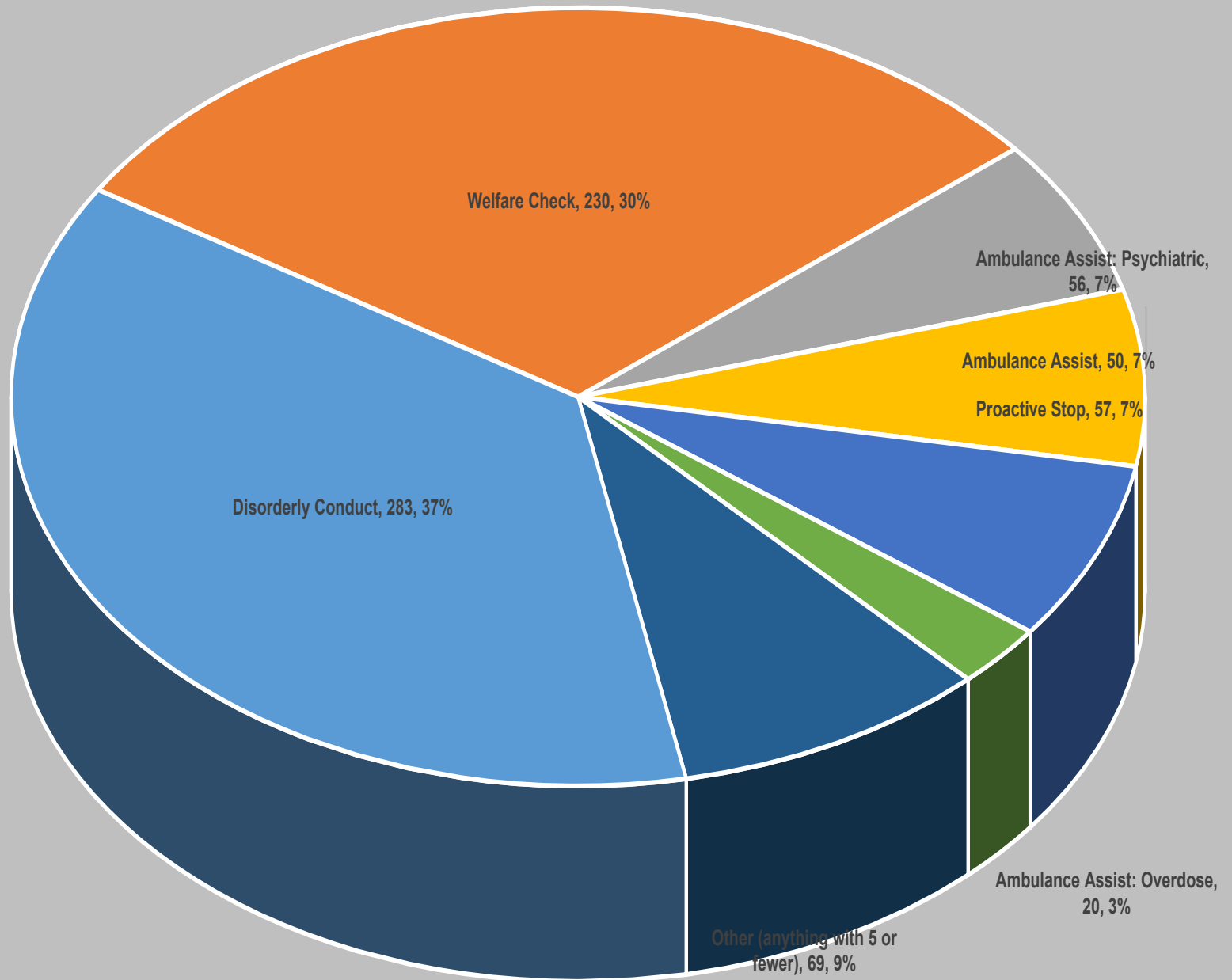

Nature of Call

Nature of Call is identified by the Regional Emergency Communications Center (RECC).

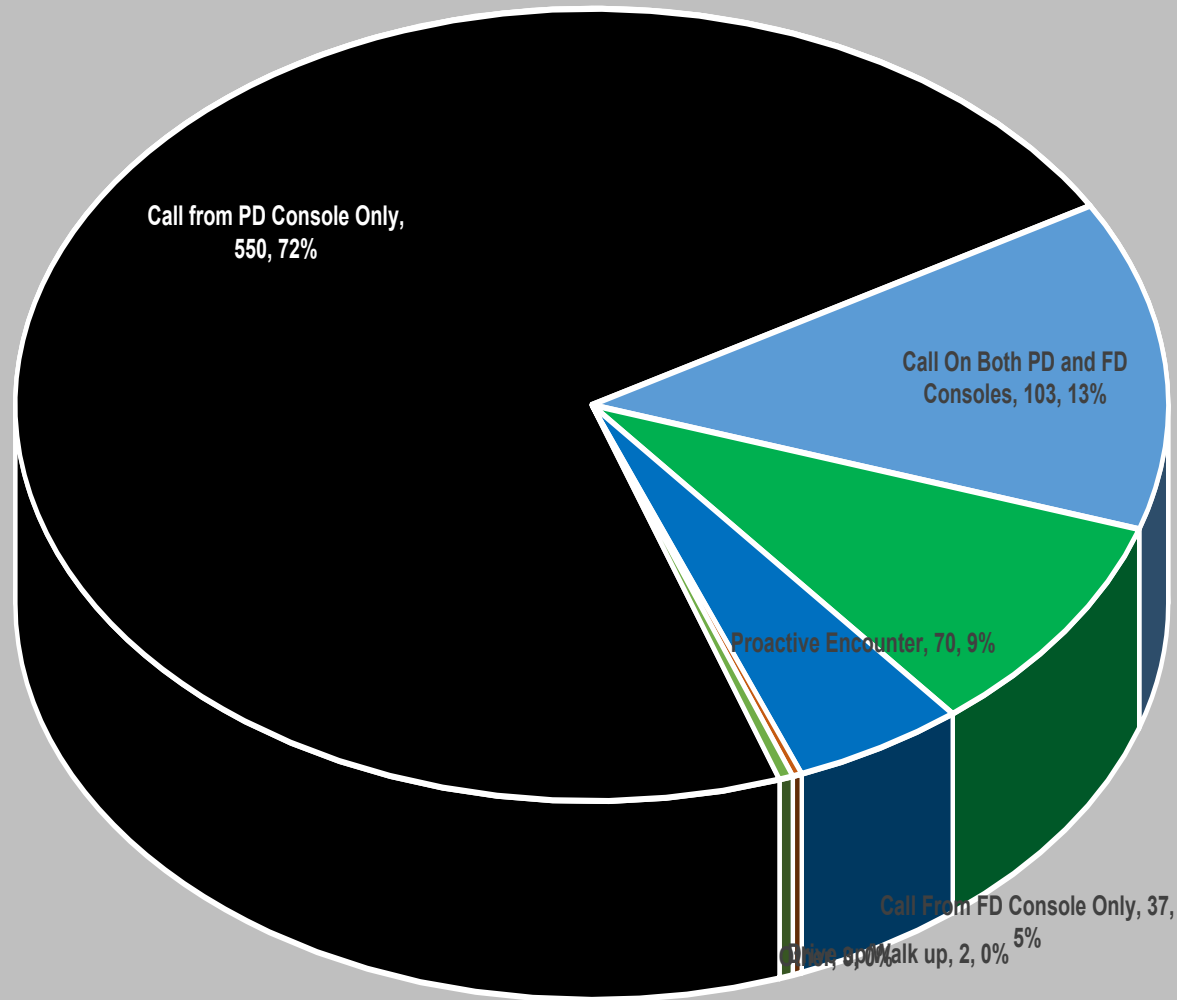
It is important to note that it is challenging to simplify complicated scene conditions into a single category. A further complication is that FD and PD dispatch consoles have different nature codes for the same call (what is a "Psychiatric" on the fire console may be an "Ambulance Assist" on the PD console, etc.)

Entries under "Other" includes incidents such as:
Cardiac Arrest,
THRIVE/LEAD Arrest
Diversion,
Narcotic violation,
Sharps call (hypodermic needle clean up), and more.

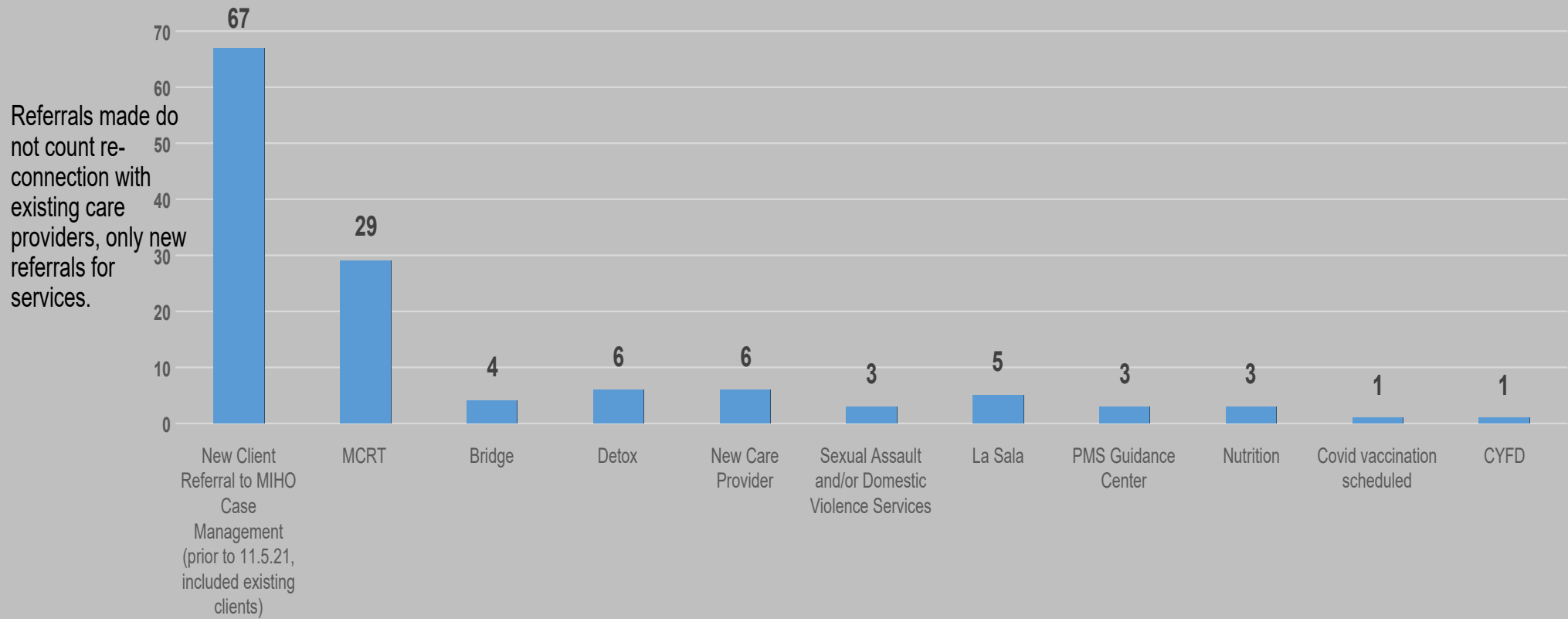


Source of Call

Calls to RECC are dynamic in nature. Calls which originate as a PD call can develop into EMS calls and vice versa. The numbers provided here are for non-duplicated, or unique, calls for service.

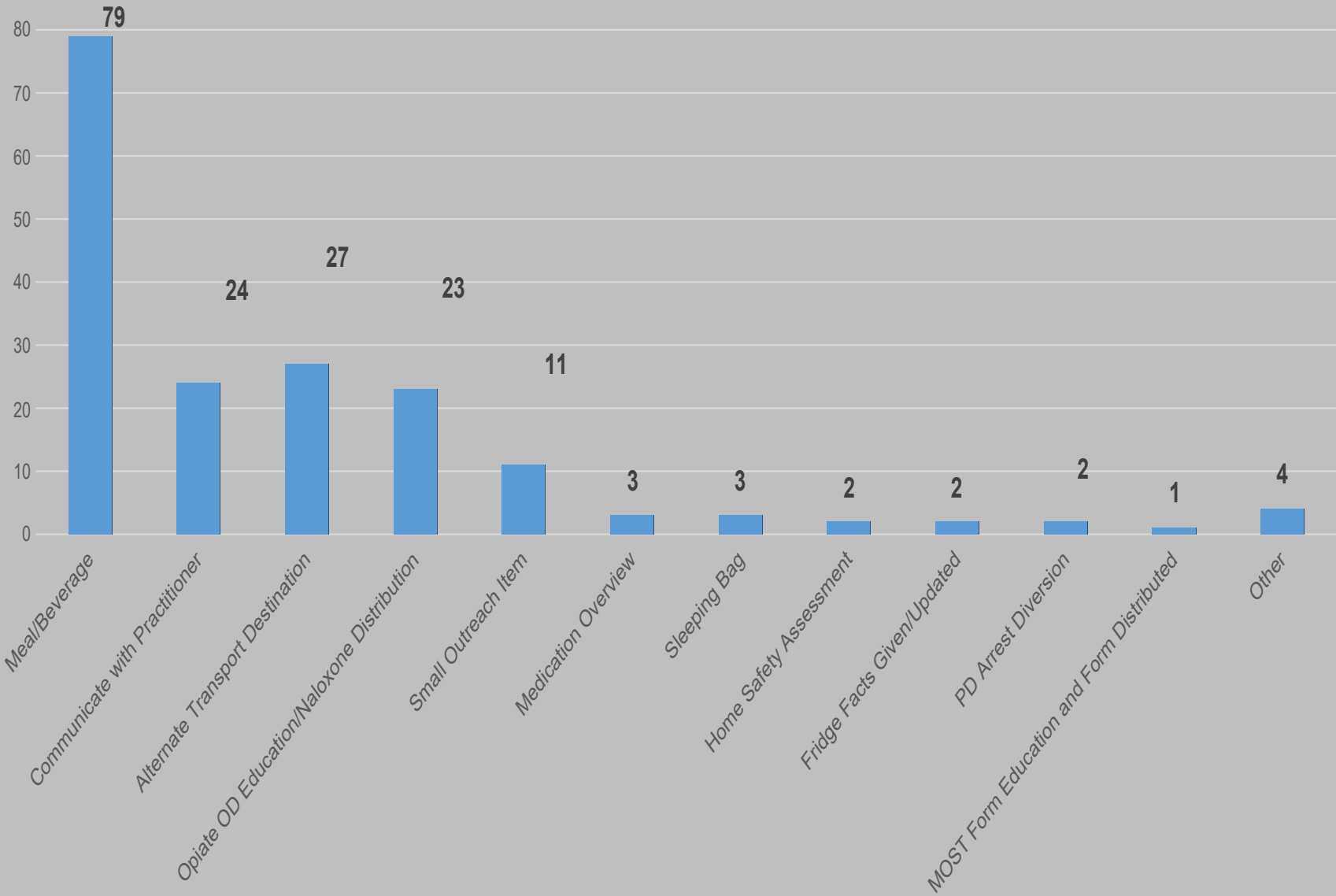


Referrals Made

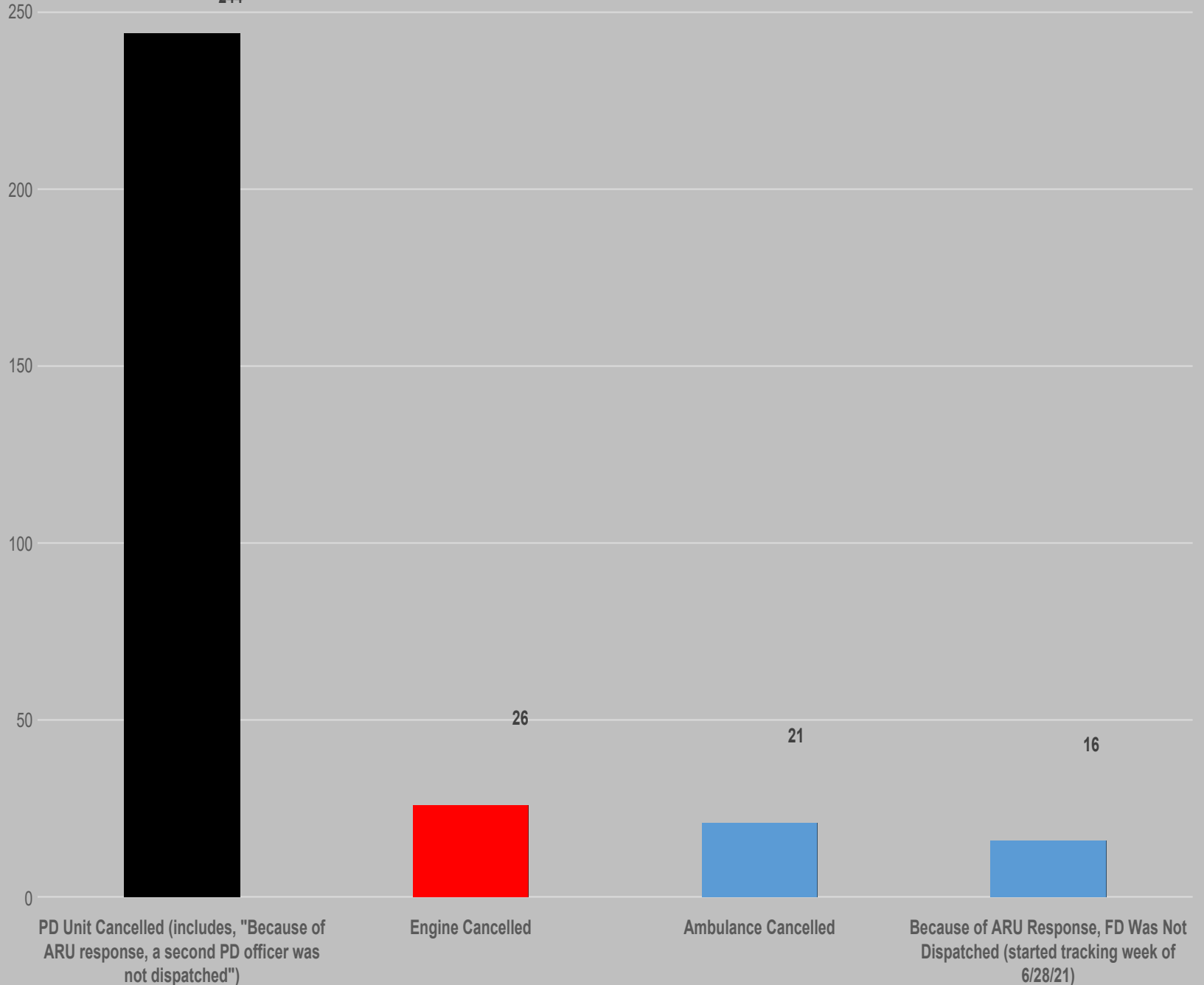
The modification to required workforce to handle these calls for service is more nuanced than this chart represents.

Some calls from the PD console which would normally "spawn" an EMS call with an ambulance and/or fire engine avoid the dispatch of these units and therefore, the units are not technically "cancelled".

On other calls, PD officers may be put "back in service" by the arrival of the ARU sooner than they would have been without this resource.

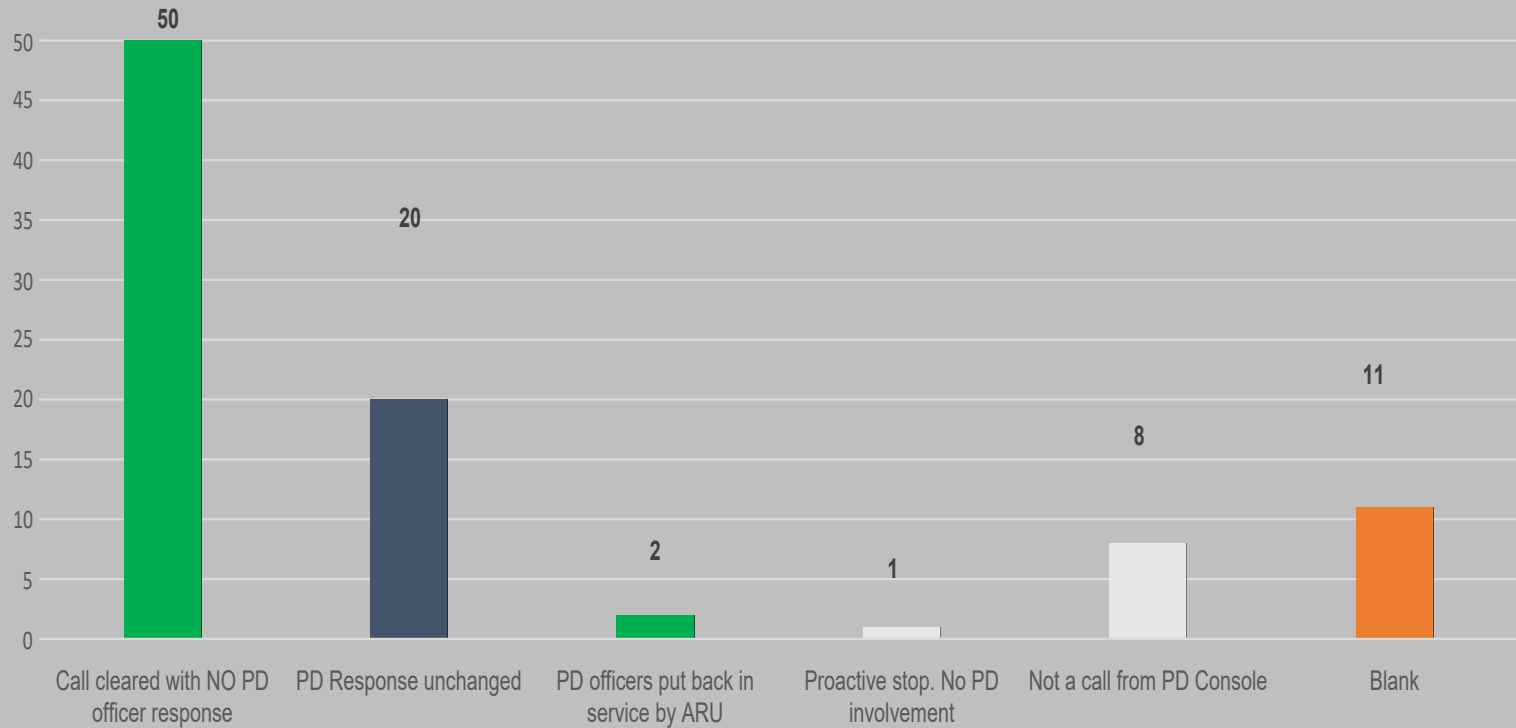
Although every PD call requires two officers per policy, RECC has not sent a second officer on many calls and thus, AR1 has not technically cancelled these units.

On 6/28/21, the PD Officer on ARU started tracking the calls on which she thinks Patrol would've active the Fire Department.



Impact on PD

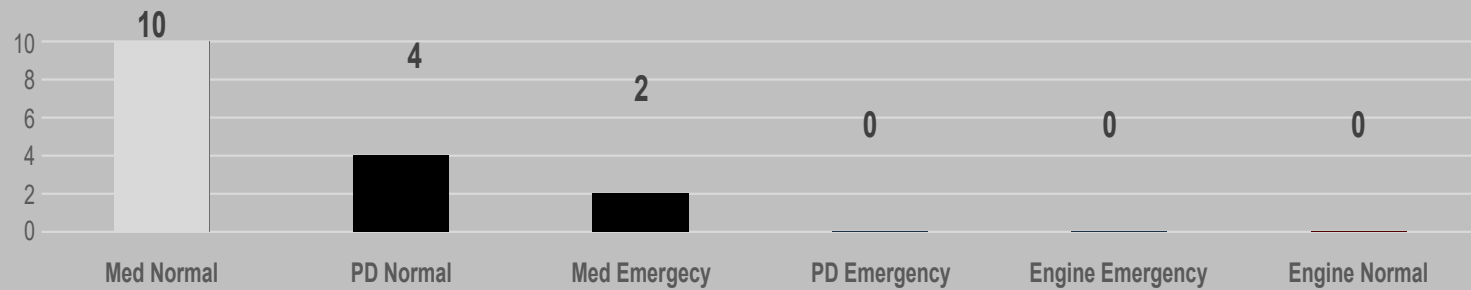
Started tracking this on 11.5.21 as a better way to capture impact on PD Patrol workload than "Units Cancelled"



Backup Requested

“Emergency” means the requested units were requested to respond emergency traffic (or lights and sirens).

“Normal” means that units were requested to respond non-emergency traffic (or NO lights and sirens).



Impact on PD (cont.)

- Impact on Patrol (Chief Joye).
- How we would like it to impact PD:
 - Reduce workload
 - Reduce putting PD in bad situations
 - Provide avenues for officers to refer to services

What This Unit Really Is

- A New First Responder. Paramedic/parasocial-worker unit
- Still optimizing (lift assist case study)
- Longitudinal (not “groundhog day”).
- Impact on fire/EMS units.

Data

- Level of Effort to clean up data is significant.
- New software contract executed. Moving to development.
Desired go-live of 7/1/21.
