the Interfaith Shelter.

1. Item 7A, BPAC representative to Acequia Trail Extension Project Stakeholders/Focus Group. I and several of my neighbors are dialoguing with the S3 Housing Initiative Consortium that is working on the conversion of the Lamplighter Inn into affordable housing, along with other actions to address the needs of the homeless population of Santa Fe. The Acequia Trail is used both as a conduit of travel and as a location to establish camps. As housing/shelter is expanded, we know the City is working on addressing the camps. But as the Trail gets extended, it will remain as a conduit of travel for those who "roam" the City, and may wish a means that is not as visible. I believe the Extension Project will extend the Trail to Maclovina Park, and perhaps beyond, which sits at the end of Declovina Street. What is the timetable and extent of this Project? We would like to ensure as we work with S3 Housing to ensure they keep in mind the various means of travel used by the homeless. Buses, sidewalks, are used, but also bicycles and walking on various trails in the City are used.

2. Item 7C is the 2023-2033 Strategic Plan notes Task 2.5, Update the City's Traffic Calming Program by December 2023. In talking with neighbors in my community of Casa Alegre-South, there has been frustration over the years expressed about the Traffic Calming Program. One example is the roundabout at Rosina and Lujan. And my neighbors on Declovina Street requested 4 months ago to have a traffic calming review be done for Declovina Street due to the current vehicle traffic, but also in anticipation to the increased traffic generated by the Lamplighter Renovation Project. No progress has been made, not even an initial dialog with either Public Works or Land Use in their review of the Lamplighter design plans. We would welcome the opportunity to offer input on this Task, and hope that it will result in a better process by the City, in the future, to address vehicle, pedestrian, bicycles, and other means of movement needs of local communities of Santa Fe. Any information that you would be able to provide about this Task would be greatly appreciated.
